Academics

ACADEMICS ARE A PRIORITY

WE HAVE ALWAYS BEEN PROUD OF THE ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS OF OUR BAND STUDENTS.

WE HAVE HAD MORE VALEDICTORIANS FROM THE BAND PROGRAM THAN FROM ANY OTHER ORGANIZATION AT MHS. A LARGE PERCENTAGE OF THE HONOR SOCIETY IS FROM THE MUSIC PROGRAM AND THE HONOR ROLL IS CHOCK FULL OF BAND MEMBERS. WE PRIDE OURSELVES IN OUR REPUTATION, NOT ONLY MUSICALLY BUT ACADEMICALLY AS WELL.

BAND IS A TIME CONSUMING ACTIVITY, AS ARE MANY OTHER WORTHWHILE SCHOOL ACTIVITIES.

STUDENTS IN BAND HAVE TO TAKE EXTRA CARE NOT TO FALL BEHIND IN THEIR CLASSWORK. A GREAT PERCENTAGE OF GRADE ISSUES COME FROM FAILURE TO TURN IN HOMEWORK. THIS IS NOT ATTRIBUTED TO BAND PARTICIPATION, BUT TO LAZINESS.

I DO EXCUSE STUDENTS FROM BAND CLASS TO MAKE UP WORK AND FOR TUTORING. THE PROPER PROCEDURE FOR MISSING CLASS TO MAKE UP WORK IS AS FOLLOWS:

1. A NOTE FROM THE TEACHER REQUESTING THAT YOU BE ALLOWED TO COME TO THEIR CLASS.
2. STUDENT TUTORS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.
3. STUDENTS MAY NOT MISS CLASS MORE THAN ONCE A WEEK.
4. THIS IS NOT A PRIVILEGE TO BE ABUSED.

IF I FEEL THAT SOMEONE IS USING THIS TO SIMPLY SKIP REHEARSAL THEN THAT STUDENT WILL NOT BE ALLOWED THIS PRIVILEGE.

Meigs Marauder Guard

Practice/Performance

1. APPROPRIATE DRESS IS: NO JEANS, NO SANDALS.
2. NO JEWELRY DURING PERFORMANCE/PRACTICE: THIS IS A SAFETY ISSUE. EARRINGS CAN GET CAUGHT IN YOUR EQUIPMENT AND RIP YOUR EAR, ETC.
3. HAIR UP AND OUT OF YOUR FACE.
4. NO GUM.
5. NO GOSSIP, SPREADING RUMORS, OR STIRRING UP TROUBLE. THE ONLY BUSINESS THAT YOU NEED TO WORRY ABOUT IS YOUR OWN.
6. THE GUARD MAY BE ASKED TO PRACTICE EXTRA. I EXPECT ALL MEMBERS TO BE PRESENT.

Equipment

1. TAKE CARE OF YOUR EQUIPMENT.
2. MAKE SURE THAT YOUR PRACTICE FLAGS HAVE CAPS (1 INCH RUBBER).
3. NEVER SIT ON A PERFORMANCE FLAG.
4. PERFORMANCE EQUIPMENT NEVER GOES HOME.
5. ALWAYS ROLL YOUR SILKS AFTER PERFORMANCE/PRACTICE AND RETURN TO ITS PROPER PLACE.
6. TAKE CARE OF YOUR UNIFORM BY CLEANING AND STORING PROPERLY.

THE GUARD IS AN IMPORTANT PART OF THE MARCHING BAND. THE GUARD IS NOT A SEPARATE ENTITY. THE DIRECTOR DOES NOT APPROVE OF THE GUARD SITTING AND TALKING WHEN THE REST OF THE BAND IS PRACTICING DRILL OR PLACING SETS.



The Winter Dress Uniform of the Marauder Band

1. THE BAND WILL SUPPLY THE COAT, CUMMERBUND, HAT, AND RIBBON.
2. THE STUDENT NEEDS TO PURCHASE A PAIR OF BLACK TUXEDO PANTS AND SUSPENDERS (THESE CAN BE PURCHASED FROM THE FABRIC SHOP IN POMEROY), BLACK GLOVES (PURCHASED FROM THE UNIFORM OFFICER OR DIRECTOR), A BLACK SHIRT (CAN BE PURCHASED AT LOCKER 219), AND BLACK SHOES (WHICH WILL BE ORDERED DURING CAMP).
3. THE UNIFORM IS DRY-CLEAN ONLY.
4. YOUR UNIFORM IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY. KEEP IT CLEAN.
5. DO NOT STORE YOUR UNIFORM IN YOUR LOCKER, THE TRUNK OF YOUR CAR, OR ANYWHERE IN THE BAND ROOM.
6. THE UNIFORM WILL REMAIN ON DURING FOOTBALL GAMES. IF THE EVENING IS EXCEPTIONALLY HOT, THEN YOU WILL BE GIVEN PERMISSION TO TAKE OFF YOUR JACKET.
7. ALL HATS WILL COME OFF TOGETHER WHEN YOU ARE GIVEN THE GO AHEAD BY ONE OF THE DIRECTORS.
8. THE GUARD WILL WEAR THE FULL UNIFORM, WHICH INCLUDES HEADGEAR, FOR ALL PERFORMANCES.
9. YOU NEED AN INEXPENSIVE GARMENT BAG TO KEEP YOUR GEAR IN. ALWAYS PACK YOUR UNIFORM CAREFULLY AFTER A PERFORMANCE. YOU ARE FINANCIALLY RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR UNIFORM.

TREAT YOUR UNIFORM WITH RESPECT. WEAR THE UNIFORM PROUDLY, IF WE DON'T RESPECT OUR COLORS WE CAN'T EXPECT ANYONE ELSE TO RESPECT THEM.

Music Lessons and Sectionals

LESSONS

ALTHOUGH STUDENT MUSICIANS ARE NOT REQUIRED TO STUDY PRIVATELY, ALL OF YOU ARE ENCOURAGED TO DO SO. THERE ARE SEVERAL AREA MUSICIANS THAT GIVE PRIVATE LESSONS AND THE COMMUNITY SCHOOL OF MUSIC AT OHIO UNIVERSITY CAN MAKE ARRANGEMENTS WITH OUR MUSIC STUDENTS FOR PRIVATE STUDY. I AM ALSO AVAILABLE TO HELP AT ANYTIME. ALL YOU NEED TO DO IS ASK.

SECTIONALS

A SECTIONAL IS WHEN A SECTION OF THE BAND, SUCH AS FLUTES OR CLARINETS, GET TOGETHER SEPARATE FROM THE REST OF THE BAND TO PRACTICE MUSIC OR MARCHING. THESE SECTIONALS ARE HELD PERIODICALLY AND WILL BE ANNOUNCED AT LEAST A DAY IN ADVANCE. ATTENDANCE TO SECTIONALS IS REQUIRED.

A SECTIONAL MAY NOT BE SCHEDULED WITHOUT THE APPROVAL OF THE DIRECTOR.

SECTIONALS WILL NOT LAST LESS THAN AN HOUR NOR MORE THAN AN HOUR AND A HALF. THE EXCEPTION TO THIS ARE PERCUSSION SECTIONALS WHICH MAY LAST AS LONG AS 3 HOURS.

WHEN SECTIONALS ARE RUN BY THE SECTION LEADERS WITHOUT THE DIRECTORS BEING PRESENT, THEN A REPORT OF PROGRESS AND ATTENDANCE MUST BE TURNED INTO THE DIRECTOR ON THE NEXT WORK DAY AFTER THE SECTIONAL.

SECTIONALS ARE VERY IMPORTANT TO STUDENTS BECAUSE THIS IS A TIME WHEN THEY CAN RECEIVE ADDITIONAL HELP AND WHEN PROBLEMS UNIQUE TO THEIR SECTION ARE ADDRESSED.

After School Practices

FOOTBALL SEASON/COMPETITION SEASON

THE MARCHING BAND PRACTICES AFTER SCHOOL ON TUESDAYS, WEDNESDAYS, AND THURSDAYS FROM 2:45 UNTIL 4:45. THESE REHEARSALS START AS SOON AS SCHOOL ENDS AND RUN UNTIL COMPETITION/FOOTBALL SEASON IS OVER IN EARLY NOVEMBER.

PRACTICES END PROMPTLY AT 4:45. IT IS NOT REALLY NECESSARY FOR STUDENTS TO CALL HOME. STUDENTS ARE READY TO BE PICKED UP BY 4:45.

STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO NOT ONLY ATTEND ALL REHEARSALS, BUT TO STAY FOR THE ENTIRE PRACTICE. ARRANGMENTS CAN BE MADE FOR STUDENTS TO LEAVE EARLY. HOWEVER, REMEMBER IF YOU ARE NOT IN YOUR SPOT IN THE DRILL THEN THOSE AROUND YOU SUFFER.

STUDENTS MUST BE IN ATTENDANCE TWO OF THE THREE PRACTICES TO PERFORM ON FRIDAY NIGHT. STUDENTS THAT ARE BENCHED DUE TO ABSENCES STILL MUST ATTEND THE PERFORMANCE, IN UNIFORM, AND SIT WITH THE BAND.

DOCTOR/DENTAL APPOINTMENTS SHOULD BE SCHEDULED ON MONDAYS. THIS DAY WAS LEFT OPEN FOR THAT REASON. LIKEWISE, SHOPPING FOR HOMECOMING OUTFITS, HAIR APPOINTMENTS, AND SHOPPING TRIPS SHOULD BE SCHEDULED ON MONDAYS.

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND THAT WHEN YOU ARE NOT AT PRACTICE, NOT ONLY DO YOU GET BEHIND BUT THE ENTIRE GROUP SUFFERS FROM YOUR ABSENCE. EVEN IF YOU KNOW YOUR SHOW AND YOUR MUSIC IS PERFECT (WHICH IS UNLIKELY) YOUR ATTENDANCE IS REQUIRED.

ALL PRACTICES ARE REQUIRED. UNEXCUSED ABSENCES FROM PRACTICES CAN RESULT IN DISMISSAL OR A LOWER LETTER GRADE IN BAND.

10. PARENTS, IF YOU ARE YOUR CHILD'S RIDE AND YOU WILL BE MAKING ADDITIONAL STOPS ON THE WAY HOME FROM AN EVENT THAT COULD DELAY YOU PICKING THEM UP, PLEASE TAKE THEM WITH YOU.
11. TO OUR COUPLES IN THE BAND...PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THIS IS A BAND TRIP, NOT A DATE. PEOPLE AROUND YOU REALLY DON'T WANT TO WATCH YOU SMOOCHING AND ACTING LIKE ANIMALS. I WOULD SUGGEST WAITING UNTIL YOUR PARENTS PICK YOU UP AND JUST CUT LOOSE ON THE RIDE HOME IN THEIR CAR. SHOULD WE HAVE ANY PROBLEMS RELATING TO LACK OF RESPECT...I WILL MAKE OUR BUSES BOY BUS AND GIRL BUS. I CAN AND I WILL.
12. PLEASE DON'T EVER WANDER OFF FROM AN EVENT. THE WORLD IS NOT AS WARM AND FUZZY AS WE WOULD HOPE. STAY WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES THAT YOU ARE GIVEN, HANG TOGETHER, AND ALL WILL BE FINE.
13. YOUR SAFETY IS MY NUMBER ONE GOAL.
14. THE DIRECTOR IS THE FINAL WORD.

EVERYTHING LISTED ABOVE IS IMPORTANT. SHOULD YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS PLEASE ASK MR. DINGESS.



Band Trips

1. YOU WILL BE GIVEN A WRITTEN ITINERARY EACH THURSDAY DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR, ON THIS ITINERARY IS BOTH A DEPARTURE TIME AND A RETURN TIME. PLEASE READ THIS SHEET.
2. STUDENTS WILL RIDE THE BUS TO ALL AWAY BALL GAMES AND COMPETITIONS UNLESS PRIOR ARRANGEMENTS ARE MADE WITH THE DIRECTOR.
3. NO MEMBER OF THE MARAUDER BAND WILL BE GIVEN PERMISSION TO DRIVE THEMSELVES TO A PERFORMANCE FOR ANY REASON.
4. AFTER OUR ARRIVAL AT A BALL GAME OR A FESTIVAL, STUDENTS MAY NOT LEAVE THE STADIUM. IF YOU WISH TO EAT, YOU WILL EAT AT THE CONCESSION STAND.
5. IT IS JUST FINE IF A BAND MEMBER WANTS TO RIDE HOME FROM A PERFORMANCE WITH THEIR PARENTS. IT IS MOST IMPORTANT FOR YOU TO REMEMBER THAT BEFORE YOU LEAVE YOU MUST HAVE A NOTE FROM YOUR PARENT STATING THAT THEY ARE TAKING YOU WITH THEM FROM THE PERFORMANCE.
6. STUDENTS MAY LEAVE WITH ANOTHER STUDENT'S PARENTS IF THEY HAVE A NOTE FROM THEIR PARENT RELEASING THEM TO LEAVE THE BAND, AND A SECOND NOTE FROM THE PARENTS THAT ARE TAKING THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE STUDENT.
7. YOU MAY NOT RIDE HOME WITH A BOYFRIEND, GIRLFRIEND, OR ANYONE THAT THE DIRECTOR DOES NOT CONSIDER AN ADULT, REGARDLESS OF THE SITUATION.
8. BE ON TIME FOR THE BUS. WHEN YOU ARE LATE, YOU MAKE OTHER PEOPLE WAIT. THAT IS RUDE AND INCONSIDERATE.
9. PLEASE HAVE YOUR RIDE HERE OR AT LEAST ON THE WAY WHEN WE ARRIVE HOME. THE ETA ON YOUR ITINERARY IS ALWAYS CLOSE TO OUR ARRIVAL TIME.

PRE BAND CAMP IS JULY 15-19 AT MEIGS HIGH SCHOOL FROM 9:00 AM UNTIL 12:00 PM. BAND CAMP IS JULY 22-26 AT MEIGS HIGH SCHOOL AND IS REQUIRED OF ALL MEMBERS OF THE MARAUDER BAND. THERE ARE A FEW GUIDELINES THAT WE ALL NEED TO FOLLOW TO MAKE CERTAIN THAT WE NOT ONLY HAVE A SUCCESSFUL CAMP EXPERIENCE BUT A SUCCESSFUL YEAR AS WELL.

1. THERE WILL BE NO EXCUSED ABSENCES FOR JOBS, DRIVERS ED, VISITING FAMILY, OR DOCTOR/DENTAL APPOINTMENTS.
2. NO STUDENTS SHOULD PLAN ON LEAVING EARLY FROM PRACTICE FOR ANY REASON.
